- · Doug Roth is a front runner for this design. Kudos!





- Note that this estimate identifies the limited scope of anticipated contracted work only. The PTPWD will perform work identified as "TWP". The concrete pedestrian pavements, the pavilion plaza, the 40'x80' 4-season pavilion, electrical facilities, lighting structure, and foundation will be performed in a subsequent phase of work as grants and PA Act 13 Infrastructure and other funding revenues become available.
- Jim Feath will further refine this estimate before presenting this limited scope of work for the current \$300,000 grant to DCNR to seek
 their approval of the project before moving into the design, engineering, and permitting phase.
- · Penn Township will apply for another DCNR grant in January 2024 to continue the next area, including the pavilion.
- Sam Ward discussed the opportunity for residents to donate memorial trees and benches in the park and suggested that a fund be established for donations to the continued park development.
- The next meeting will be held on July 13, 2023, at 6:30 pm in the Penn Township Municipal Building, 157 Airport Road, Butler, PA 16002.
- Melissa Heagy made the motion and Karen Trempus seconded the motion to adjourn. The motion was approved and the meeting concluded at 7:45 pm.
